Reader

Community Group Questions

- 1) The people of Israel had been obeying the laws of God, and yet an evil pharaoh still enslaved them. Too often we believe the lie that if we follow God's commands, our lives will be easy. What are ways in which you believe this lie?
- 2) Vs 8 tells us that, "Then a new king, to whom Joseph meant nothing, came to power in Egypt." The king was choosing to forget how God blessed Egypt through Joseph. What are ways that you choose to forget God's blessings and goodness from your life? Why do we do choose to forget?
- 3) Exodus begins with the type of "and" that implies the story is still continuing. God's promises have not been forgotten, and even though he may seem silent, God is still at work in the story of the Israelites. In the same way, those who claim Christ as their savior are still in the middle of their story. How is it a comfort to know that God is still at work on your story?

Children's Ouestions

Pharaoh chose to forget that many, many years ago, God sent Joseph to help save Egypt from a famine. He did not want God to have any of the glory. Are there times that you forget about how much God has loved you and cared for you? Why do you think you forget about them?

Call to Communion and Prayer

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please eat the bread privately, and then drink the cup together with us after everyone has returned to their seats. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Children who have been examined by the elders and admitted to the Lord's Table are able to partake of Communion.

The ministry of prayer is one of the ways we live together as a community of believers and seekers. During Communion, members of our prayer team are available at the front of the sanctuary. It would be our privilege to pray with you as we walk together through the joys and struggles of life. We also encourage you to pray with one another in the pews during this time of movement in our service.



Step into Respectful Evangelism | Christianity Explored



What can we learn... from Brennon and Megan



Megan and Brennon work with Cru in East Asia helping to lead a campus ministry at a local university where nearly half of the students come from people groups with little or no access to the gospel.

Respectful Evangelism

There are a variety of cultural realities that make sharing the Gospel difficult. If they are not careful, Megan & Brennon can easily offend and alienate people. They have to navigate these cultural realities in a respectful way.

Meaningful Relationships in Community

Their evangelism work is highly relational. They have to build deep, meaningful relationships in order to bridge cultural divides that are often vast. The relationships they have with their local church are also vital in helping them persevere in their work.

Desperate Dependance on Jesus

The cultural pressures they face along with the stress of trying to navigate often tricky relational dynamics with students forces them to have a desperate dependance on Jesus. They are reminded every day that the Lord is the one doing the work to soften the hearts of the students at their university.
