# **Community Group Questions**

- 1) Read Exodus 17:1-2, 7. What did Israel do that tested the Lord? Look again at our confession of sin. How do you test the Lord by doubting him in these same areas as the Israelites?
- 2) First Corinthians 10:4 says that the Israelites drank from the spiritual rock that accompanied them, and that rock was Christ. How does the story of Exodus 17:1-7 point to Jesus and his redemption?
- 3) In light of what God has done for you through Christ, what is one concrete way that you need to trust him right now for his provision or protection or presence in your life?

#### Children's Question:

When Moses strikes the rock to give water to the Israelites, it is a wonderful story of how God takes care of our needs like food and water. But it also tells us an even bigger story of how God takes care of our sin. It gives us an Old Testament picture of Jesus. Where does God say he will be in this story (see Exodus 17:6)? Why, do you think, he tells Moses to strike the rock with the staff? How can this story help you trust God to save you?

# **Call to Communion and Prayer**

### Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel to receive Communion with us. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please eat the bread privately, and then drink the cup together with us after everyone has returned to their seats. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to partake of Communion.

The ministry of prayer is one of the ways we live together as a community of believers and seekers. During Communion, members of our prayer team are available at the front of the sanctuary. It would be our privilege to pray with you as we walk together through the joys and struggles of life. We also encourage you to pray with one another in the pews during this time of movement in our service.

I want you to lead my life. I want to know you and to receive your love for me. Please teach me and protect me and guide me. I am yours. I ask these things in the name of Jesus. Amen.

#### Prayer of Doubt and Faith

God, I don't really believe all of this, but there is a part of my heart that knows there is truth and goodness here. I am confused by the fact that there are so many things that I don't understand or that make me angry about you. There are also so many things that fill my heart with hope and many things that draw me to you, and I want to put my trust in you. God, you say I can come to you and ask for anything, so if you are real, please give me the faith I need to believe. Give me the desire to continue to seek after you. Keep my heart from self-deception. Protect me from any evil misleading or binding spirits. Calm my fears. Soften my cynicism. 
### Kids, Save the Date! Gospel Music Camp is coming to Redeemer!




### Redeemer Students: Encounter Indy
