God has all life,^a glory,^b goodness,^c and blessedness^d in and of himself. He alone is all-sufficient, in and to himself, not standing in need of any creatures which he has made,^e nor deriving any glory from them,^f but rather manifesting his own glory in, by, to, and on them. He alone is the fountain of all being, of whom, through whom, and to whom are all things.^g He has absolute sovereignty over them, to do by them, for them, or upon them whatever he pleases.^h In his sight all things are open and manifest;ⁱ his knowledge is infinite, infallible, and independent of his creatures;^j so that nothing to him is contingent or uncertain.^k He is most holy in all his counsels, in all his works, and in all his commands.^l To him is due from angels and men, and every other creature, whatever worship, service, or obedience he is pleased to require of them.^m

Call to Communion

Guidelines for the Reception of Communion

Redeemer welcomes to Communion all Christians who are willing to forsake their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation and who are members of congregations which proclaim the gospel. We will be coming forward for the distribution of Communion. Please use the hand sanitizer. You will receive the bread into your hands and take a cup from the tray. Clear cups (located in the interior rings) contain grape juice. Red cups (exterior ring of tray) contain wine. Wait to eat the bread and drink the wine until we all do so together, once we are back in our seats. Children who have been interviewed by the elders are able to share in Communion.

Communion is a time of connection with the Lord Jesus and with each other. Feel free to sing with the band during Communion. The ministry of prayer is also a way we live together as a community of believers and seekers. Please take the time to pray on your own, or with someone else in the pews.

I want you to lead my life. I want to know you and to receive your love for me. Please teach me and protect me and guide me. I am yours. I ask these things in the name of Jesus. Amen.
