Community Group Questions

1. *We can be tempted to think that the way things are is the way they will be. We look around at relationships, our family situation, things that are going badly or well for us, even larger social realities—and we figure that how they are now is how they will always be. When you see things that way, what effect does that have on you? What feelings does it stir? Do you tend toward hopelessness? What about complacency? Do you double down and try harder to change them?*
2. *What do we learn about God's character from Haggai 2:20-23? It might be helpful to read also Jeremiah 22:24-30; 23:5-6; and Acts 2:29-36 to give some context both before and after. Think broadly about what these promises tell us about who God is. How then can that nurture your trust in him?*
3. *God promises in these verses to overturn all world powers and structures—the way things just are—and establish in their place his Messiah to reign in justice and righteousness. How does the fact that this promise still hasn't come true after 2,500 years make it hard to believe it? Yet, where can this promise cultivate faithfulness and perseverance for you?*
